

Assessment schedule: Skill Standard 40575

Learners do not need to complete a BCATS project to be awarded this skill standard. However, they must provide sufficient evidence as stated in the assessment resource. If they participate in a group to complete the project, learners must demonstrate an appropriate level of skill for all skill standard requirements.

Evidence is required for a range of BCATS parties that may include others in the project team, other trades, suppliers, health and safety supervisor, project supervisor etc.

The schedule below shows the evidence required for assessment criteria in the skill standard, guidance for the teacher and judgement statement/s.

Note: teacher observations and comments made in the assessment resource serve as key evidence requirements for each skill standard. All guidance below is intended to support the teacher's observations/comments.

Evidence must meet the minimum of Achieved criteria as outlined in the Waihanga Ara Rau BCATS Programme Guidance document – SS 40575. Comments related to the award of higher grades must reflect commentary in the Programme Guidance.
	Copies of emails, notes, order forms, or other communication with relevant parties about the project.	Evidence provided must show the communication made by the learner with other parties of relevance to the project.	
	Copy of the project brief.	The project brief is to be provided as a means of seeing the intended project and comparing it with the result at the end of the construction process.
