Assessment: Basic communication

Learner instructions

This assessment is about using communication skills to progress your BCATS project (*or related tasks as part of a group*).

For this assessment activity, you need to look at the project instructions and explain clearly what you need to do and use to complete the project. Fill in the worksheet on the next page with this information.



- Describe the project and what materials you will need to complete it. If you are working in a group also include the people in your team and their roles.
- Describe the tasks you need to carry out from start to finish, tools you need to use, any help you might need, etc.

Example answers have been given below.

Description of the project

A wooden storage box, 600mm x 400mm x 350mm, with a hinged lid.

It will be made from plywood and have a metal handle and hinges.

It will be fixed together with screws and wood glue.

	Tasks in each project stage.	Things that need to be done to make sure it is completed successfully
1	<i>Measure and cut the ply sheet</i>	<i>First step is to cut the base, front and back, 2 x sides and lid. I'll use a hand saw for this and then sand all the edges.</i>
2	<i>Next step is to assemble the box</i>	<i>Using wood glue and screws, the sides will be fixed to the front and back with butt joints at the corners. The sides will then be fixed to the bottom.</i>
3	<i>Attach the lid</i>	<i>The lid will be fitted with 2 hinges and be screwed to the back panel.</i>
4	<i>Hide the screw holes</i>	<i>Cover the screws with wood filler and sand it down smooth once its dried.</i>
5	<i>Fit the handle and feet.</i>	<i>Measure the position for the handle and feet and make some pilot holes</i>
6	<i>Finish coating</i>	<i>Make sure it opens and closes smoothly (check with the teacher that it's all good), then stain it.</i>

Example log entries have been given below.

Person or party: <i>Mr Green and me</i>	
What was said or asked? <i>Mr Green said I would get a better finish if I used 220 grit sandpaper then went up to 320 for a super smooth surface.</i>	What was the response? <i>I was worried about the time it would take to sand the project so many times.</i>
How did the communication result in positive changes to the project? <i>I did use the finer grit sandpapers and even went up to 800. The final surface feels really smooth.</i>	

Person or party: <i>Sam and me</i>	
What was said or asked? <i>I needed advice about the colour of stain and varnish for my project</i>	What was the response? <i>Sam said that if I want my project to be more striking, then a lighter stained project will look better against a dark coloured wall.</i>
How did the communication result in positive changes to the project? <i>I used a medium/light stain colour on my project and it looks really good.</i>
