

Skill standard assessment schedule

40559 – Identify employment opportunities in BCATS industries (4 credits)

BCATS industries and roles of interest to the learner must be demonstrated for assessment.

BCATS industries refer to any building, construction, and allied trades, including on-site and off-site work, as well as those involved in the planning and administration of construction (i.e. carpentry, concrete, exterior plastering, floor and wall tiling, glass and glazing, interior systems, joinery).

The schedule below shows learning outcomes, the evidence required for assessment criteria in the skill standard, guidance for the teacher, and judgement statements.

Note: Teacher observations and comments made in the assessment resource serve as key evidence requirements for each skill standard. All guidance below is intended to support the teacher's observations/comments.
